What is a phoneme?

Phonemes are the smallest unit of sound that forms a part of speech. These include:

- consonant phonemes
- vowel phonemes

There are five types of vowel phonemes:

- 1. Short vowels: a, e, i, o, u eg: fl<u>a</u>t
- 2. Long vowels: ay, ee, ie, oa, ue eg: st<u>ay</u>
- 3. R-controlled: er, ir, ar, ear, air eg: f<u>air</u>
- Dipthongs: mouth changes or air glides oi, ow

eg: s<u>oi</u>l

5. Schwa: an unstressed or lazy vowel found in multisyllabic words.

eg: dragon, about, elephant, brother

Phonemes are the sounds of the English language that we hear and say.

Gillieston Public students are participating in the 2024 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC).


